Shoot for the Stars Activity Plan

Time: 3-5 minutes

Suggested Materials

- Star pattern
- Construction paper
- Pencils

- Markers
- Hole punch
- String

Instructions:

- 1. Trace star pattern.
- 2. Cut out your star.
- 3. Write/decorate your own dreams for the future.
- 4. Hole punch the top of the star.
- 5. Tie a string through the hole to create a loop.
- 6. Hang from your windows for everyone to see!

OR

- 1. Find images of constellations.
- 2. Cut out stars.
- 3. Decorate stars.
- 4. Recreate constellations with stars.

Extra Information:

- A star is a huge ball of gas made up of mostly hydrogen and helium.
- The Sun is the closest star to Earth.
 - The Sun heats and provides light to our planet.
- Groups of stars can form imaginary outlines of shapes, people, or animals that we call constellations.
 - Constellations help tell us the position of stars and our own position on Earth.
 - To see a certain constellation is dependent upon the time of day and year.

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
